Ski & Snowboard Program



Expert-led one-on-one winter lessons offered across Summit County's ski areas that provide all-inclusive instruction, specialized gear, and mountain access for adaptive skiing, snowboarding, ski biking, nordic skiing, and snowshoeing.

Wilderness Program



A diverse array of accessible summer adventures ranging from multi-day retreats for groups to individual adventure days designed to build confidence and increase access to the outdoors for all ability levels.

Internship Program



A premier professional development program that graduates two annual classes of future adaptive industry leaders with hands-on training and technical outdoor instruction.

Volunteer Program



Providing essential support to our staff and participants during adaptive lessons and offers professional growth through our volunteer-to-instructor training program.

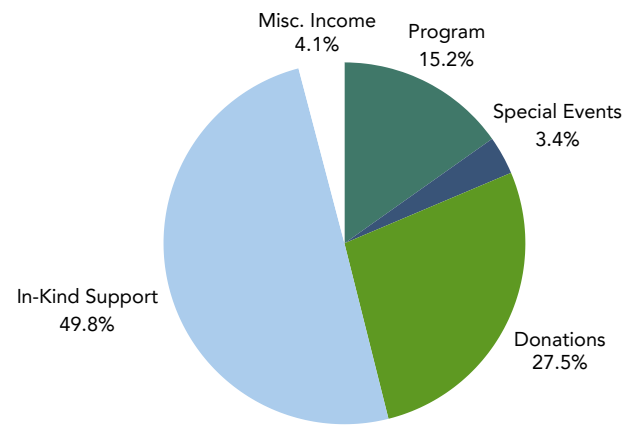
